Executive Director Report

The Victoria West Community Association operates the Victoria West Community Centre and offers a variety of programs and services designed to meet the diverse needs of the Community. Victoria West Community Association provides recreation and leisure programs, youth outreach programming, special events, and facility rentals. VWCA also operates childcare services, including preschool, daycare, and out-of-school care.

The past year presented our organization with significant challenges and opportunities.

The COVID-19 Pandemic in March 2020 sidelined our operations and meant the cancellation of all Centre programs and rentals and the layoff of four of our Centre Operations Assistant staff.

Childcare operations continued to operate as an essential service from March-September 2020 thanks to Emergency Grants through Child Care Operating Funding (CCOF) provided by the Province of British Columbia. This funding source allowed for the retention of staff and childcare spaces for families temporarily withdrawing from care.

We successfully obtained a Canada Summer Jobs grant in the amount of \$3735.00, which provided a wage subsidy for VWCA Summer Camp staff. Our internal Summer Camp program supported 106 school-age children in 2020.

VWCA also continued to work towards the opening of two new (3-5 years) daycare centres on Sherk Street. These centres are made possible by an \$850,000 grant from the Provincial Childcare New Spaces Fund and will open in the Spring of 2021, providing 32 new daycare spaces for the Victoria West community.

VWCA staff also provided support for the 2020 Get Growing Program operated by the City of Victoria. This program allowed for the distribution of approximately 5000 seedlings to 300 members of the community, enabling individuals the opportunity to grow their own food during this time of economic uncertainty.

Victoria West Community Association is proud to be able to provide support and to serve the community during this challenging time. I would especially like to thank the VWCA Board of Directors and Staff for their steadfast dedication and resilience.

Food Security Collective Committee Report

The Vic West Food Security Collective was first created as an action project from the 2003 Victoria West Community Association Vision Project. Over the past 17 years, the FSC has worked on various projects and events to strengthen production, consumption and access to food that is safe, nutritious, affordable, locally produced and environmentally sustainable. One of the main objectives of the FSC is providing opportunities for Vic West to build a resilient neighbourhood.

Our guiding principle is...cultivating community by growing and sharing food!

In September 2020 the FSC transitioned to a committee to align with the VWCA governance model. The new committee has seven members; new members are always welcome. If you can assist in any of the projects, events or have ideas on how we can grow a sustainable Vic West food system, please contact Patti <u>foodsecurity@victoriawest.ca</u>

A big THANK YOU to all the volunteers who gave their time to help with the projects. **63 volunteers, 29 work parties for a total of 386 hours**.

The volunteer work would not have happened without the leadership of **Louise**, the Community Garden Volunteer Coordinator – Great job! The FSC would also like to thank the VWCA staff for their support throughout 2020.

This past year was one of change. No volunteer events were scheduled in March as events were cancelled. COVID best practices from the City and province were implemented starting in April to ensure social distancing and facilitate post-event tracking if required. COVID forced an adaptation in our volunteer coordination process. The regular open public invitation to help in the gardens transitioned to formal volunteer registration and an online scheduling system to build/schedule one team of five for each weekly event and two teams of five for the weekend events. This new system limited the potential number of volunteers and the opportunity for casual drop-ins resulting in less work achieved. However, the new team structure provided an environment for a deeper connection between volunteers and greater familiarity with the garden maintenance tasks, therefore reducing the need to supervise the volunteers. Also, a broader volunteer outreach resulted in more volunteers from outside the community. People were thankful for the opportunity to help.

Grants

The City of Victoria's Community Garden Volunteer Coordinator \$10000 grant supports the VWCA part-time staff position for coordinating volunteers to assist with maintenance of Banfield Park Community Orchard, Banfield Commons and VW Tea Garden, and doing community outreach to support Vic West in growing their own food. In April we said good-bye to **Solara Goldwynn** as the Coordinator and welcomed **Louise Kelaher** in May. These Vic West public food assets would not be possible without the support of the grant – thank you City of Victoria!

A City of Victoria \$500 Micro Grant was received to fund the purchase of hospitality equipment to support volunteers.

New projects/events

Free Seeds in Free Library Boxes

The FSC partnered with Victoria Seed Share to distribute 500 packages of free vegetable seeds in Vic West's eight Free Little Library boxes. COVID created a big demand for vegetable seeds for

many people growing their own food. Seed supplies from retail stores and online suppliers were scarce so the FSC jumped into action to support Vic West food growers. A special THANK YOU to **Kristy** for her help with this project.

Free Leaf Mulch Distribution

The FSC partnered with the City of Victoria to provide free mulch for pickup in Banfield Park on May 10 & 11 and October 15. Thank you to **Kristy, Tara, Lorna** and **Amy** for helping with the May distribution, Louise for the October distribution and to the City of Victoria for supplying the mulch. Mulch will be available again in 2021. Follow VWCA and FSC on Facebook to receive news of the mulch distribution days.

Children's Garden in the Orchard

A new garden bed was planted in Banfield Park Orchard to support VWCA child care programs. VWCA staff work hard to enrich the lives of the children in an outdoor environment to create new land stewards and food growers. Thank you to **Agnes Sillem** for her leadership and food growing passion, and Hatchet and Seed for their gift of garden edging.

Ongoing projects<u>/</u>events

Banfield Park Community Orchard and Banfield Commons

The Orchard was maintained through weekly volunteer days and two-weekend work parties led by **Louise** from May to October. See attached Community Garden Volunteer Report for full details.

People braved the winter conditions (cold temperatures with snow and MUD on the ground but no rain) to toast the trees at the 2020 Wassail on January 18th. The Wassail is a popular event with approximately 100 people attending each year. The apple cider served is harvested from Vic West trees.

<u>Rayn or Shine Community Garden</u> (behind Spiral Cafe)

The garden continues to provide growing space for 9 gardeners and a community harvest garden along the fence – everyone loves the blackberries! The garden was closed to visitors due to COVID restrictions. The garden waitlist is at 15, and that is sure to grow.

Evans Street Orchard

Special thanks to **Stewart, Jack** & **Lori** for the continued support in the orchard. The Orchard contains apple, plum, fig and pear trees along with raspberries, strawberries, black currants and hazelnut shrubs.

Vic West Corn Roast

The 2020 Corn Roast was cancelled due to COVID restrictions.

Vic West Tea Garden - at the Community Centre

The Tea Garden includes herbs and fruit open for public harvest for making tea. The strawberry patch was replenished thanks to a generous donation of 30 plants from **Pat McGuire**...Thank you, Pat!

Dormant projects/events - Require a Project Lead to grow again!

Vic West Urban Farmers (VWUF)

VWUF is a network of people who support each other in growing food by sharing knowledge, seeds, and plants. Activities include Growing meetings/workshops and seed/plant exchange.

<u>Tour de Coop</u>

The annual Tour de Coop showcasing Vic West chicken coops was not held in 2020.

Community Garden Coordinator Report

2020 was a busy year. We hosted two Facebook live events in April & August, in line with the City's "Get Growing" program. These events garnered 760 and 1200 views, respectively and are still available as a resource online, giving us a reach far greater than a one-off seminar for ten people.

Thirty-six individuals over 29 work parties donated 386 hours to the maintenance and improvement of the commons. Fifteen individuals volunteered more than two times, and we now have a core Monday Maintenance crew of 5-8 people who attended at least once a month.

A new list of currently 86 individuals is looking forward to volunteering with us in future. Due to PHO, we were unable to host groups larger than five or support community events as is in the past. However, hopefully, we will be able to reintroduce these in 2021.

In the gardens this year, we accomplished:

- The rejuvenation of the Tea garden which had become overrun with lemon balm.
- Sheet mulching of commons to continue the improvement of the soil and suppress weeds.
- Each week along with the maintenance work, Patti provided some educational aspects pertaining to the garden, for example, tree pruning, fence weaving, harvesting fennel seed and pollen and transplanting.

Harbour & Parks Committee Report

The Victoria West Community Association (VWCA) Harbour Committee (HC) represents the constituents of Victoria West on harbour related and waterfront issues and initiatives. The HC fosters and supports Harbour related initiatives and services that enhance our community and add to the quality of life. The HC hears community concerns, raises awareness, and encourages and supports the community in taking ownership of our waterfront community. A key objective is to ensure the community makes the best use of the harbour to foster the economic and environmental well-being of the community.

The HC participates in the Gorge Waterway Initiative. The GWI is a collaborative, communitydriven group of organizations concerned with protecting and enhancing the natural and cultural features of the Gorge Waterway, Portage Inlet, and the surrounding watersheds.

The entire Victoria Harbour was declared a Migratory Bird Sanctuary in 1923. The Friends of Victoria Harbour Migratory Bird Sanctuary are preparing with others to celebrate the 100 year anniversary in 2023.

The Victoria Harbour Airport is the only defined water airport in Canada. While traffic volume is down this year, there is an ongoing concern among residents about the safety, health and noise hazards of floatplanes taking off and landing within close proximity to residential condo buildings. Harbour Air has committed to moving to all-electric planes which if followed through has the potential to reduce some of the current hazards.

Progress has been made by the City and the Federal Government in cleaning up the derelict and live-in boats on the Gorge. The focus of City Staff on the pandemic has delayed work to complete the removal of the few remaining boats.

The Federal Government has completed the remediation of the parking area at Laurel Point, now named Peter Pollen Park, and has handed the land over to the City to complete the park and its amenities. Again, this work has been postponed due to the pandemic.

There have been meetings with the City Parks Department on the plans for the completion of the park space at the Victoria West side of the Johnson Street Bridge.

The Community Association has been working with City Staff on plans for Banfield Park.

The harbour continues to evolve from an industrial only port to be a resource to be shared by the whole community. Transport Canada, NAV Canada, and the Coast Guard are government agencies that have a role in managing our harbour. While these organizations are receptive to community engagement, the pandemic has limited engagement. It is important that our Vic West Community, which shares a large part of the harbour shoreline, have a voice on harbour planning.


Projects & Events Committee Report

Transportation Committee Report

The transportation committee meets on the second Tuesday of each month. With its proximity to downtown and it's beautiful trail infrastructure, the Victoria West neighbourhood offers exciting opportunities and challenges in the area of transportation. Thanks to **Adrian Mohareb** for his ongoing work on this file.

Although meetings and interactions with both the community and the city have slowed down somewhat this past year due to Covid, there have been significant developments in the Vic West neighbourhood's transportation infrastructure over the past year.

The city has been receptive to safety concerns and has made some significant upgrades, including installing lights at three crosswalks on Craigflower Road, increasing signage for the school zone in all directions around Vic West elementary (a priority item for the Transportation Committee last year), and introducing a protected pedestrian area on Langford St in the block closest to Skinner St.
